

Cyber Hacks - Social Engineering Attacks

Social Engineering attack is when an attacker (cybercriminal) uses human interaction (social skills) to obtain or compromise information about an organization or its computer systems. However, by asking questions, he or she may be able to piece together enough information to infiltrate your accounts or an organization's network.



Best Practice

- Always report suspicious email by using the Cofense Report Phishing button located in your Outlook toolbar.
- Be suspicious of unsolicited phone calls, texts or email messages from individuals asking about sensitive information. If an unknown individual claims to be from a legitimate organization, try to verify his or her identity directly with the company.
- Never reveal sensitive and personal information in email, and do not respond to email solicitations for this information. This includes following links sent in email.
- Instead of clicking the link provided in the email, it is recommended to visit the website directly to validate that it is legitimate.
- Always enable multi-factor authentication (MFA) for banking and when available. Brink's uses OKTA as (MFA) to provide an additional layer of security.
