What a Moon-Day!

Capturing the Exciting Total Solar Eclipse of 2024

More than 30 million people in North America were in the path of totality today and had the opportunity to see the moon fully block out the sun in the total solar eclipse. An additional 150 million people were able to see a partial solar eclipse, with the path being 108 to 122 miles wide. The total eclipse first appeared along Mexico's Pacific Coast at around 11 a.m. PDT, then traveled across the U.S., from Texas to Maine, and into Canada.

Numerous Brink's team members were in the path of totality and shared a few snapshots and thoughts on the day. "What an exciting experience to share with the team," said Aissel Crichlow, Communications – Canada. "We only had partial totality in Toronto, and the moment was tremendous!"

One minute the sky started to turn dark, and then it was as if the sun had set, yet it was directly above us. The clouds parted, the wind stopped, and everything seemed to be still. Take 5 For Safety: Seat Belts Help Prevent Injuries

Wearing a seat belt is the single most effective way to prevent serious injury in a crash. Seat belts hold you in place, if you stop quickly or swerve to avoid another vehicle or object, you're held firmly in your seat. You're held securely where you can easily reach the steering wheel and brakes, and you can avoid losing control of the vehicle.

Seat Belts Worn Correctly Make a Difference

Just as important as the act of fastening a seat belt is making sure that it is worn properly. A seat belt is most effective when it is worn with lap and shoulder belts in the correct places - across your chest and away from your neck, and the lap belt should be secured tightly over your upper thighs/hips.




One way to ensure your personal safety is to always wear your seat belt when the vehicle is in motion.

Cyber Hacks: Watch Out for Spam

Spam is the electronic equivalent of 'junk mail'. However, spam is more than just annoying, it can also be dangerous. Spam can include malicious links that infect your computer with malware.

Useful tips to protect yourself against spam:

- Attackers often use spoofed email addresses (email addresses that appear to come from a trustworthy source) to trick the recipient.
- Don't click any links or attached files, including unsubscribe links. Spammers sometimes include these links to confirm that your email address is legitimate, or the links may trigger malicious webpages or downloads.
- Always report suspicious emails using the Cofense Report Phishing button located in your Outlook toolbar. By taking this small action, the correct department will be alerted and will put controls in place to avoid further Spam emails!
